Have you thought of getting a job working with the Amazon shipping department? Do you love unwrapping presents? We have an opportunity to get practice with our national shows. Art gets juried in from out of state for both National Shows. We don't know how many pieces till after the jurying is completed. Sometimes it is less than 10, sometimes more. When pieces come, it is important to unpack them (carefully) to make sure there is no damage, and that the proper paperwork is included. Then after the show, we repack those that weren't sold. Member Interview

Barb McKee

Barb McKee may be the one and only painter you meet who paints "Botanical Puns", which is her description of her unique style. Wikipedia defines "pun" as "a form of word play that suggests two or more meanings... for an intended humorous effect". Translating this then, a Botanical Pun for Barb means painting a Hen and Chickens plant with chicken legs on the bottom and an egg growing within the leaves, or painting a Pronghorn Cantaloupe, giving it a tiny nose and antlers and calling it a Pronghorn Antelope! But all this fun is backed up by solid credentials -- Barb is a Certified Botanical Illustrator, a title she received after completing the Botanical Art and Illustration program at the Denver Botanic Gardens. Her medium is watercolor, and she is very careful to paint her botanical subjects (fruits, vegetables, flowers, etc.) very accurately to be true to her credentials. Her watercolors are superbly done, and she explains that "painting just a flower" would not interest her and that art should be fun. Barb finds her inspiration from the grocery store produce section, her own garden, and gardens within her neighborhood. If she gets an idea and can't find the right plant, she grows it herself and waits, impatiently, the many months for it to be ready for her project. She recently became a signature member of the

Later he started his own business making metal sculptures, primarily for the Scottish community that they're heavily involved with. (She has been a competing bagpiper for 30 years; he a Champion Drum Major.) Barb and Don even wrote a book called "Stained Glass from the Pubs of Scotland and England", which gave them some memorable travel experiences in those countries.
